Bottineau Children's Reading Program



A big concern for immigrant communities is the ability of their children to be familiar enough with American English that they can thrive in school. Recognizing this, Somali mothers in Bottineau neighborhood approached BNA last August with the idea of a reading group for neighborhood children in which local volunteers would read aloud to their children, thus increasing their exposure to English as spoken by native-born speakers. Other recent immigrants in our neighborhood, including Russian and Spanish speakers, have also expressed an interest.

In response, volunteers Liz Reiser, Tory Moore, Lisa Moore and Fadumo Abdi have begun a read aloud program for children aged 1-12. The group meets **Friday evenings from 5:30 PM to 6:15 PM at Bottineau Park Community Center** (2002 2nd St. NE). All participating children are allowed to keep a book from the

program and a drawing is held at each session for a \$5.00 Target gift card to be used for buying a book of the winner's own choosing.

This program, which primarily aims to help children with the pronunciation and comprehension of American English, is open to any child in the neighborhood. To accomplish its goals, young readers are tutored one-on-one as they read aloud with a volunteer; pre-readers are read to by native English speakers. In this way, the children become better prepared to hear and understand English when they go to school.

Basketball Registration is RIGHT NOW

Don't miss the sign-up period for Bottineau Basketball. The deadline for all registrations is December 27, 2013. Boys teams and girls teams are taking shape NOW.

For any age child who is new to the sport, the BB fundamentals class will teach the basic details of play at a cost of \$25. The competitive team level, at a cost of \$40, is league play; participants will compete against other park teams throughout Minneapolis. Because these are age-based leagues, a birth certificate is required for all players.

Register at Bottineau Park in person. If you already have a birth certificate on file at Bottineau, you may call 612-370-4958 and register over the phone. But remember: December 27 is the deadline, so register TODAY.

Redesigning Lowry Ave NE

The 2002 Lowry Ave NE redesign plan is being updated and a community involvement program is being put in place. Here are some of the details:

Stantec Engineering has been chosen to create a new design for the Lowry Ave NE corridor, a Hennepin County project because Lowry Ave is a county highway. Important players involved with the project include Linda Higgins,

Bottineau's representative on the Hennepin County Board, and Carol Anderson, the county planner in charge of the project. In late November, the Hennepin County Board approved \$324,760 for design services.

Board members and residents will be asked for input beginning January 30, 2014 at the BNA community meeting at ESNS 1700 2nd St NE from 7-9 PM (see page 1). If you are concerned about any of this and want to make a positive contribution to the process, please plan to attend.

Empty Bowls NE

Empty Bowls is an international grassroots effort to address hunger and it's coming to NE Minneapolis on Saturday, December 14 from 11 AM to 5 PM at East Side Neighborhood Services (1700 2nd St NE).

Gardening Corner: *MPRB's Draft Urban Agricultural Plan*

Here's an interesting development: Minneapolis Park and Recreation Board (MPRB) has adopted a draft *Urban Agriculture Plan* (UAP) and is currently seeking community reaction and input.

The UAP has three over-arching goals. The first of these integrates with park programs and services, providing nutrition education to the public, as well as access to healthy foods and economic support for the local food system. Along these lines, for example, MPRB could award food vendor contracts to businesses that serve or produce locally grown sustainable foods.

Second, park facilities will support renewal and development that fosters urban agricultural activities. Among other things, this may lead to the composting of organic park wastes (leaves, grass, etc.) and/or an improvement in park kitchens citywide.

Third, some varieties of local food could be cultivated on public park land because it benefits residents, park visitors and the environment. For example, edible fruit trees may be grown for common public harvest.
