Gasthof Update

BNA recently met with Gasthof management to continue discussing certain livability issues that are created and exacerbated by the periodic tent events held at Gasthof zur Gemutlichkeit. We were able to inform him that the relocation of the 'Biffs' was greatly appreciated and some of the other steps taken seemed effective in addressing the concerns of the neighborhood, Mario notified BNA that he only plans two outdoor events this year, Oktoberfest and combination of the May and Summer Fests. He also agreed to speak with his security staff and have them be more diligent and attentive when it comes to mitigating these issues with patrons both when they congregate outside and when they leave at the end of the night.

It was also interesting to note the number of more recent noise complaints during the winter and not related to these tent events. This is directly related to the smoking ban in Minneapolis. Patrons of not only the Keller Bar but also any other neighborhood bars must go outside to smoke. Again, because of the proximity of these bars to nearby houses, it was unfortunately inevitable that the amount of noise increased. We will continue to monitor these complaints and work with Gasthof management to find appropriate solutions.

Now that spring has sprung, we can start thinking about the completion of the asbestos removal action at Gluek Park on Marshall Street. The EPA is aiming at an early June restart date according to an email from Sonia Vega, EPA On Scene Coordinator. She said that spring is generally too wet in this part of the country and drier soil conditions are needed to complete the work. [Editor: This seems a bit ironic as they have to spray water on the soil when they remove it.] Continue to look in future issues of the *Gazette* for a more definite date.
