Rain Barrels Available

Minneapolis is making rain barrels available thanks to a grant from the Environmental Protection Agency's Region 5 Great Cities Program and in partnership with Minneapolis/Metro Blooms and the Green Institute.

The cost of a barrel is \$45, which is about half their normal retail price. Barrels are available to Minneapolis residents for use on Minneapolis properties, and there is a limit of one per household. You can order the rain barrels at www.thereusecenter.com or by phone at 612-724-2608. Quantities are limited, so it's a good idea to pre-order.

Starting in May, pre-ordered barrels will be available for pick-up at the ReUse Center at 2801 21st Ave. S. Re-Use Center hours are Monday to Thursday from 10 a.m. to 8 p.m., Friday and Saturday from 11 a.m. to 7 p.m., and Sunday from 11 a.m. to 5 p.m., and the center accepts credit cards, checks, or cash.

A limited number of rain barrels will also be available for sale and pick up at three neighborhood events:

The 55-gallon rain barrels are made of 100 percent recycled plastic. They are bulky, so bring a suitable vehicle to pick them up (rain barrels are 32 inches high and 24 inches wide and weigh 18 pounds).

The first of Gasthof zur Gemutlichkeit's annual tent events is approaching. Maifest will be held on three consecutive weekends starting May 4th and 5th. Most of the revelers are respectful, but there always seems to be those few who ruin it for everyone. The Bottineau Neighborhood Association has asked the Minneapolis Police Department to direct additional patrols to the area on these nights to keep the unwanted behavior down and to monitor parking (and to ticket if cars are parked blocking driveways, alleys and hydrants). Below are a few phone numbers that might be needed:

- Call **911** if it is an emergency (medical assistance is needed, suspicious activity, or to report a crime in progress)
- Call the **owner** to make him aware of what is happening – sometimes they really don't know. Gasthof's phone number is: 781-3860.
- Call **BNA** at 782-2145 to let us know so we can help document complaints. It helps when we have to work with the owners and City officials to understand the full range of problems.
- Call **Councilwoman Hofstede** at 673-2203 to make her aware of the problems.
- Call the City's **Licenses and Consumer Services** Department at 673-2080 to register your complaint. This is the department that controls the business licenses.
