Park Field Upgrades

Whether or not you agreed with the legislation authorizing (and partially funding) the new Twins Ballpark, the neighborhood is about to reap some benefits from it.

The fields at Bottineau Park are one of five throughout the City that received funding from the Hennepin County Youth Sports Grant program created by the same legislation. These are the only fields in NE to receive funding through this program. (Van Cleve is close. but technically in SE.)

How much planning has already been done isn't clear. If you use the field and have suggestions, Eric at Bottineau is happy to listen. We're sure the new Commissioner, Liz Wielinski, would be happy to hear your thoughts as well.

Bottineau received \$130,000.

You may have noticed in the most recent Northeaster Newspaper, that the 2010 election season is already gearing up. Even with that, you may be interested to see the new lineup downtown.

There has been a slight change to the City Council Committee structure. Health, Energy and Environment, and Public Safety and Regulatory Services are reorganized to Public Safety and health, and Regulatory, Energy and Environment.

Councilwoman Hofstede is continuing her work in those two committees (among others). And Councilman Reich is more directly involved in the planning, transportation and development end of things. Not forgetting the Park Board... Liz Wielinski is now a member of every MPRB committee except Operation and Environment. She is the Chair of the Recreation Committee. She too has been appointed to numerous other Board and Commissions.

One common thread among the appointments is (not surprisingly) the Mississippi River. All three of them are involved in the Mississippi Watershed Management Organization (see p.3) and the relatively new Mississippi Riverfront Corporation either as the appointed member or an alternate.

2010 Census

The beginning of the decade brings with it the US Census. First completed in 1790 it has become a quite more significant undertaking. The US population at the first census was about 4 million people. Today it is about 304 million.

Why should anyone take the time to fill out the form? First, it doesn't take that long. The form you will get in the mail is only 10 questions long – yep, one side of a piece of paper. Second and more importantly, the results of the Census help determine how over \$400 million a year of Federal funds gets allocated. That is over \$4 trillion over the next decade. These funds are used by states, counties, cities and other municipalities for things like: Hospitals, job training centers, schools, senior centers, ridges, tunnels and otherpublic works projects and Emergency services among many others

Census information affects the numbers of seats your state occupies in the U.S. House of Representatives. And people from many walks of life use census data to advocate for causes, rescue disaster victims, prevent diseases, research markets, locate pools of skilled workers and more.

Lastly, it is a chance to make a few bucks. Census workers in Minneapolis will be paid \$16.50/hour. The duties, time commitment and other information can be found at:

Other 2010 Activities

Other than the exciting news about the Bottineau fields, there are several other things occurring in 2010 that will impact the neighborhood. Among them include:

2220 Marshall Street: Demolition. The City Council approved the demolition of this building on December 18th and the action was published in Finance & Commerce on December 26th.

Lowry Bridge: Construction. The Super America will come down first and then starts the pile driving. The County plans on holding an open house early this year. Check with the BNA website or Commissioner Stenglein's office for more details.



Local IBEW Hall: Demolition. Maybe not in 2010, but there will be some changes. The Mississippi Watershed Management Organization purchased this property last year and will be building a new structure for their offices, classrooms, conference rooms and more.

18th Avenue Pike Path: Ground Breaking. Again, maybe not in 2010. There have been some delays with getting required easements and some design modifications. This will be an off street path that will get you from the river to roughly Monroe. (Phase II is from Monroe to the Quarry and is in the planning stages waiting funding.)

22nd Avenue Bicycle Boulevard: Implementation. Bike boulevards have been created in Berkeley, Portland and Vancouver. With few east / West connections in Northeast, this will be a welcome addition to make bike travel safer.
