BNA Board Elections

This year there are three nominees running for three open seats.

Even though there are three candidates for three seats, the neighborhood association is required by law to hold an election. You will find information on the nominees inside this issue. Please use the enclosed ballot to vote for up to two nominees. You may return the ballot by mail (we must receive it by October 23rd for it to be counted) or you can drop it by the BNA Office at 2205 California St, #107 (and slide it under the door) or bring it to the October neighborhood meeting (see Notice to the right).

Another \$70,000 for Neighborhood Housing Input Needed

BNA has reached a milestone in implementing the neighborhood NRP Plan – it's been three years. This means that the 30% of the funding that has been held back (why is a long story) is now available. These funds are legally required to be put towards housing and housing related improvements.

A lot has changed in the last three years. Foreclosures are up, there are more vacant properties, some property values have fallen, the economy is very different, and the list goes on.

The BNA Board would like your input as to how these funds could be best spent to benefit the neighborhood. They have grouped the realm of possible

1. Improvements to Occupied Homes:
➤ Additional funds for improvements to owner and renter occupied homes.
2. Address Vacant/Foreclosed Properties:
➤ Funding to purchase and/or rehab vacant properties; possibly reconvert duplexes to single family
3. Promote New Development:
➤ Funding to help acquire property for new housing



Thank you for your consideration and I hope to serve you well.


BNA Ballot
