Political Season Now Open

While the official season opening for politicians was July 21, things will soon start to swing into full gear. Because Minneapolis has changed the way it conducts elections to a ranked choice voting system (often referred to as Instant Runoff Voting or IRV), there will be a lot of names on the ballots this year. Remember, there will only be one chance to vote on November 3rd.

The races affecting the Bottineau neighborhood and the (number of names on the ballot) are:

- Mayor (11)
- City Council, 3rd Ward (5)
- Board of Estimate and Taxation (6 – two winners)
- Park Board, at-large (8 - three winners) and
- Park Board, District 1 (3)

Educate Your Children About Bus and School Safety

With the start of the new school year, the Minneapolis Police Department is reminding parents/guardians and children about safety. The following tips are just a few suggestions:

- Stay away from the bus until it comes to a complete stop and the driver signals you to enter.
- When being dropped off, exit the bus and walk ten giant steps away from the bus. Also, remember that the driver can see you best when you are away from the bus.
- Stay away from the bus until the driver gives his/her signal that it's okay to approach.
- Be aware of the street traffic around you.
- Walk the route to and from school with your children, pointing out safe places.



- Talk to your children about strangers approaching them and ploys they might use. Teach your children that it is okay to say NO - tell them to trust their instincts.
- Remind your children never to give the impression they are home alone if strangers telephone or come to the door.
- Since a growing number of kids are riding their bikes to school, make sure they always wear their helmet. Helmet use can reduce the risk of head injury by up to 85 percent.
- Be aware of putting your child's name on anything that is readily visible. This might allow an abductor to get on a "first name" basis with your child and develop a sense of trust.

Where's that Confounded Bridge

Now that the smoke has cleared and dust settled, many of us are probably wondering how the County plans to live up to its promise to "salvage, recycle or reuse more than 90 tons of steel and other related items." from our beloved Lowry Bridge.



Here's what they've decided to do with at least some of it.

In July, The Minneapolis Arts Commission approved a design for the Hiawatha Public Works Facility Yard, located at E. 26th Street and Hiawatha. The approved design uses the grating (the part you could see through while driving over) of the Lowry Bridge to create an artistic fence and decorative trellises that will surround the building. The recycling of the bridge helps this project comply with the LEED Gold Standard certification, which is the first of its kind for Minneapolis.

The Hiawatha facility's LEED features include several environmentally responsible and money saving systems. Energy-efficient systems include geothermal heating and cooling and a white roof. The facility also incorporates systems to recover energy, reuse the existing materials on the site, control storm water (pervious pavement and underground retention systems) and landscape with native plantings that resist drought. The reconstructed Hiawatha Public Works Facility is scheduled to open in spring 2010.
