community members from various Northeast neighborhoods, sponsored by the Bottineau Neighborhood Association—is developing a community survey about occurrences of cancer in neighborhood families.

The survey will take place in the spring and early summer. Volunteers are being trained to do this sensitive survey work in a factual, non-biased manner as the results need to be scientifically verifiable and defensible. They will be interviewing residents who have survived cancer or whose family members have died because of cancer. Currently, EEQL is gathering data from various government agencies such as the Minnesota Department of Health, Minnesota Division of Vital Records, the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency, the EPA and other groups. Over the next three years, Minneapolis government leaders are putting together a comprehensive plan for 2040 and you can be a part of it. Marshall Street Protected Bikeway

The ad hoc group that has been meeting to encourage safe biking on Marshall St NE with a protected bicycle path has decided to seek federal grant funds for the effort. The grant application is due June 30, 2016. Currently, business, neighborhood, county government, city government and resident approvals are being sought. City and County staff are working on the grant application.

The protected bikeway—in one form or another—is listed on many planning documents, including the Mississippi River Trail (MRT) which is the first US bicycle and pedestrian route to be established in Minnesota.

Marshall St NE is also the park boundary of the Above the Falls Master Plan approved in 2000; both sides of Marshall St NE are part of its envisioned boundary. If you want to follow that development more closely, the Above the Falls Citizen Advisory Committee (AFCAC) meets every

fourth Tuesday of the month at 2117 West River Road (MPRB headquarters) at 6:30 PM. The public is welcome to attend.

18th Ave Bike Path to ... Nowhere?

Great Northern Greenway bike path advocates met February 12th at the Fire Museum and decided its route across north Minneapolis should follow 26th Ave N (a thoroughfare that bisects ALL of north Minneapolis) and head east across the river via the BNSF rail bridge. In Northeast, the group decided to run the Greenway down ... 18th Ave NE?

Residents here know that a bike path cannot reach the river via 18th Ave because it's not a thoroughfare. Unless, of course, this path jumps the BNSF tracks at 18th and Monroe, cuts through the Madison Lofts condominiums (just west of the tracks) and we tear down the new senior citizen housing on Washington St. NE. Great plan!

There is a better option. The 22nd Ave NE bicycle boulevard is currently striped for biking and already makes use of speed bumps in various sections from Stinson Boulevard to Marshall St NE. There are no physical barriers between Marshall St NE on the west and the Diagonal Trail on the east. 22nd Ave NE is also the only thoroughfare crossing northeast Minneapolis that is **safe** for bicyclists. Perhaps this new Greenway should follow 22nd Ave NE, no?
