Eastside Environmental Quality of Life (EEQL) Update

Bottineau Neighborhood Association (BNA) and Concerned Citizens of Marshall Terrace (CCMT) have hired a new Research Coordinator, Jim Olson, to spearhead the air toxins research we are conducting in neighborhoods near the Lowry Bridge.

Any organization that hopes to intervene on the permits of industrial polluters must first qualify by collecting 3 years' worth of air testing data. As of October 7, 2017, the MPCA data that BNA has downloaded meets the EPA's National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS) for intervening on the GAF and NMR permits. The reason this has been successful is because EEQL (a joint committee formed by BNA and CCMT) persuaded the MPCA to do the necessary air monitoring and sample testing which began in October 2014.

While the community waited for the NAAQS data to be completed, EEQL studied the frequency of air pollutionrelated deaths in neighborhoods near the Lowry Bridge, conducting our own air sampling and testing for PAHs (polycyclic aromatic hydrocarbons) that are primarily emitted from asphalt smelting operations and shingle plants. This work was then able to leverage a \$500,000 Community Air Monitoring Project (CAMP) at the Lowry Bridge beginning in January 2016, but expanded to

include a PAH study at its Lowry air monitoring site on July 7, 2017.

At a minimum, one complete year of data is needed to show how chronic illness are caused by air pollutants that exceed health risk values in populations exposed to air toxins. MPCA recently delivered the three years of data showing which air toxins have exceeded the health risk values in the Lowry Bridge area to EEQL. When the health analysis is complete it will be published.

While our permit intervention goes forward, the case against the polluters will be bolstered with another health study focused on people who live near the Lowry Bridge, working to show how likely it is that instances of cancer, asthma and leukemia are due to air pollution. The study will document the intensity of local asthmatic episodes while also studying the oddly high cancer rates found in

neighborhoods around the bridge.

Keep your eyes open for a health survey in your mailbox. We are conducting a random survey for this study so <u>it is very important that those</u> <u>who receive the survey fill it out and</u> <u>return it promptly</u>. Lives may depend on the survey's findings.

BNA will also be starting a Go Fund Me Page to help pay for the upcoming research costs. In addition, a fundraiser was held on Nov. 3 and 4 at the *California Dreamin'* open studio event to support this research.

That Darned Bridge...

The BNSF Bridge across the Mississippi River in North/Northeast Minneapolis (near 16th and Marshall) is a crucial link in plans to create a greenway across the northern stretch of Minneapolis, which would be the only greenway of its kind in this part of the City. The bridge is also a critical element to the Park Board's *RiverFirst Vision* – envisioning parks and public access along the riverfront throughout North and Northeast Minneapolis.

That said, you are invited to attend a meeting to begin the process of <u>turning</u> <u>this dream into a reality</u>. In this first gathering of stakeholders, we will develop an understanding of the current status of the bridge and develop a framework for moving forward.

Pumpkin Carving Success



Title V Polluters within 1.2 miles of the Lowry Bridge



If not regulated properly, a *Title V polluter* emits the type of pollution most likely to cause severe health problems in humans. The map above shows Title V polluters in the area around the Lowry Bridge. Each of these contribute to poor air quality experienced in the area. Some cause more of the air pollution than others. BNA, with the help of EEQL, has studied these health effects by examining our area's death rates over the past 19 years. That study can be found on BNA's website at http://tinyurl.com/BNA-pollution-study. Our new project will study living residents to find out how often people in the community are getting sick due to air pollution. The MPCA can determine which pollutants in the area come from which polluters. BNA is currently seeking that data.

Local Industrial Polluters, as marked on the map above:

A: **GAF Building Materials** (50 N. Lowry) Asphalt smelter and shingle maker. Pollution: 2.5PM & 10PM particulates, VOCs and PAHs.

B: Northern Metals Recycling LLC (1803 N 2nd St) Auto recycling and crushing.
Pollution: 2.5 PM & 10PM particulates, including lead, chromium & other metals.
C: Hard Chrome Inc. (2631 NE 2nd St) Coats metals for industry, electroplater with chrome, zinc, nickel and copper. Pollution: 10 PM or larger particulates.

D. **Pinta Foamtech** (2601 49th Ave N – Moved recently out of the Upper Harbor Terminal area) Foam coating. Pollution: VOCs, clean-up of soils needed.

E. Xcel Energy Riverside Plant (3100 Marshall St NE) Coal fired until 2007 natural gas conversion. Pollution: SO2 and particulates, coal ash residue in soils.
F. G & K Services (2108 Washington Ave N) Commercial laundry. Pollution: VOCs
