The new speed limits are:

- 20 mph for local residential streets;
- 25 mph for larger, arterial city-owned streets; and
- 30-plus mph for a few city-owned streets.

Northeast Calendar call for art, due September 10th

The call for art is open for the 2021 Northeast Calendar, coordinated by the Northeast Community Development Corporation (NE CDC). Images are sought that represent the 14 Northeast neighborhoods. The deadline is September 10, 2020.

An image may be representative of a neighborhood simply due to the artist living or working in that neighborhood, or it can be a landmark. All art mediums welcome, represented in digital images.

“We are looking for active, colorful, beautiful and/or funny images that bring cheer and a feeling of togetherness, community,” organizers said in a news release. “We encourage active images of people: Photographs of people who are readily recognizable should be accompanied by a release from the subjects.”

Thirteen images will be chosen for the months Jan. 2021-Jan. 2022, each for \$200, and one for the cover, \$400. Images will be juried by independent professionals. The calendar will be designed by graphic artist Leann Johnson. For submission criteria and procedure, go to northeastcdc.org.

The 2020 Census is a tool to combat homelessness and provide affordable housing

What does affordable housing have to do with the Census?

The U.S. government uses a formula to decide how much money for housing assistance will go to each state. The formula uses information about the size of a state’s population and the number of people living in different types of housing – and that information comes from the decennial Census.

If people do not complete the Census form or do not list all of the people living in a residence, it could result in:

- The overall Census count for their community being lower than it should be
- An inaccurate count of how many people are living in each type of housing
- Their state not receiving their fair share of federal funding to address the housing needs of its people.

Complete the census at my2020census.gov, call 1-844-330-2020, or simply fill out the form you received in the mail and return in the envelope provided.
