## The Upper Harbor Terminal Project

The 48-acre Upper Harbor Terminal site is owned by the City of Minneapolis and located along the Mississippi River, generally between the Lowry Avenue and Camden bridges. The site is the largest remaining single-owner development opportunity along the river and offers almost a mile of riverfront in north Minneapolis.

The City is seeking input on the redevelopment plan for the Upper Harbor Terminal. You can access the Draft Plan, watch the new project video, and provide comment on the Draft Plan by taking an online survey on the project website by Jan. 15, 2021. 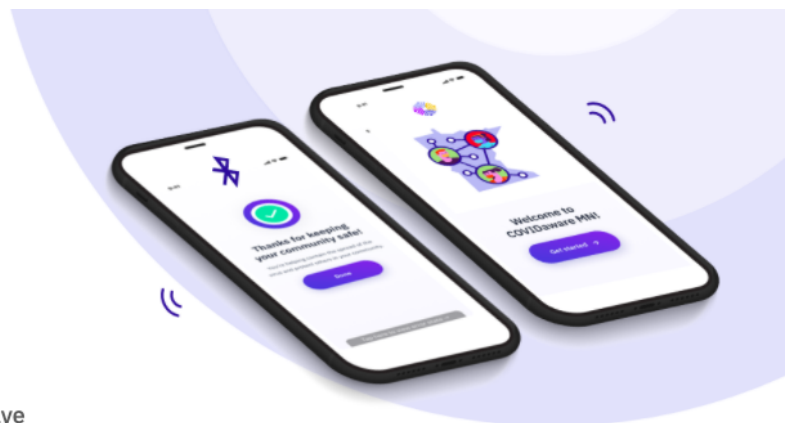
### Minnesota Black Community COVID-19 Hotline

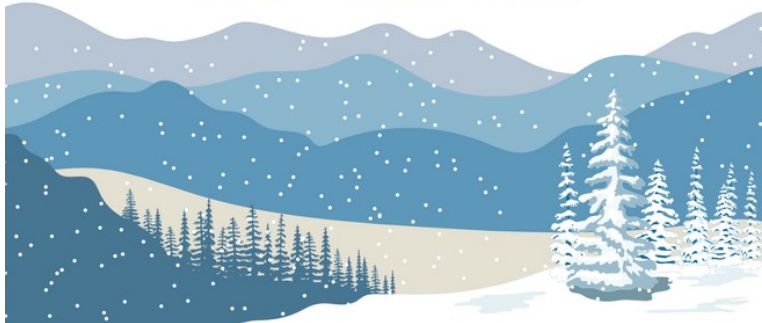

### Notice of Funding Availability for affordable housing

The City of Minneapolis just released a notice of funding availability for affordable house. The two financing opportunities – (1) Minneapolis Homes: Financing Program and (2) Missing Middle Rental Housing Pilot Program – will collectively have approximately \$5M of funding available to develop affordable ownership and rental opportunities on City-owned and privately owned sites throughout Minneapolis.

Submissions for all options are due at 1:00 p.m. on Friday, January 29, 2021. Over 300 vacant City-owned parcels and approximately \$5 million of financing are available for development activities through three different pathways.
